# INTRODUCTION

## What's new?

This year, we have switched to six-month training programmes by area of work. This allows us to be more responsive to law and policy developments, and in particular to keep up to date with the pace of welfare reform. We have also produced a training programme specifically for social security due to its importance in relation to welfare reform and the introduction of Universal credit. We have increased flexibility by tailoring our training delivery to include evenings and weekends.

## FREE Training on Welfare Reform including Universal Credit (2.5hrs)

This year, we will be delivering a host of FREE welfare reform training including free courses on Universal Credit which is due to be introduced in Northern Ireland from September 2017. We will be delivering multiple courses within our Belfast & Derry/Londonderry offices and can also provide in-house training for certain organisations. Please contact the law Centre for further information and to book this free training.

## Developing courses through feedback and partnership

This programme has been developed to meet the needs of our member agencies. Feedback from members, trainees and users of our advice line is reflected in the design and delivery of courses. This ensures that our programme responds to the needs of the advice sector and that we focus on complementary work.

## Bespoke training for your needs

If you would like us to deliver a free training session mentioned above or if we do not offer the course you are looking for, please get in touch. We understand that organisations may want us to deliver a bespoke course to their staff within their own venue from time to time. We have successfully provided external training to groups and agencies in the past.

This type of training is dependent upon personnel and resources but we will always try, where possible, to meet any request.

## Accessible venues

We only use venues with suitable facilities and disabled access.

Most Belfast courses are held Law Centre Central (NI), 124 Donegall Street. Western Area courses take place in a number of venues.

## Specialist tutors

Most of our courses are delivered by our training officer and legal advisers. Our legal advisers deliver training within their own specialist areas of work. Other trainers are sometimes brought in for their expertise on a particular topic.

# LEVELS AND QUALIFICATIONS

## Course levels

There are no formal entry requirements to any of the Law Centre's training courses. It is assumed that participants will have literacy and numeracy skills consistent with what is required for their advice work.

These descriptors state how much knowledge of a subject or practical experience is required and indicate who would benefit most from a course at that level.

### Introductory

No prior knowledge of the subject or specific experience required. Suitable for all advisers and legal practitioners, new or experienced.

### Intermediate

Social security courses are suitable for advisers who have attended Welfare Rights Adviser Programme or equivalent courses. For other areas, suitable for advisers and legal practitioners who have gained relevant experience in the subject.

### Advanced

Requires at least intermediate level knowledge of the subject and relevant practical experience. Suitable for experienced advice practitioners.

## National Occupational Standards

Law Centre courses are linked to National Occupational Standards (NOS).

NOS allow a clear assessment of competence against nationally agreed standards of performance, across a range of workplace circumstances for all roles.

NOS have been developed for many sectors, including the legal advice sector, to help provide a clear list of the skills and knowledge needed to work in this sector.

They also form the basis of qualifications, most commonly National Vocational Qualifications (NVQs) and Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs). They are used in the Integrated Competency Framework (ICF).

## Open College Network Northern Ireland (OCNNI)

Welfare Rights Adviser Programme is accredited by OCNNI at level 2 and level 3. The Tribunal Representation course is accredited at level 4.

## Continuing Professional Development

All Law Centre courses count towards Continuing Professional Development requirements for advisers, solicitors and barristers. See CPD points in each course description.

# HOW TO APPLY

## Application forms

There is an application form in the back pages of this programme. **It is recommended to book early.** Late applications, particularly for the Welfare Rights Adviser Programme, may not be considered because of the demand for places. Closing dates will be published on our website nearer the time of each course.

## Payments

Payment must be made either with the application form or within fourteen days upon receipt of invoice. Please indicate on the application form if you require an invoice. Where the offer of a place on a course is accepted, payment must be made by the date indicated on the invoice.

## Cancellations

Should circumstances mean that you have to cancel your course and are unable to transfer your booking to another date at the time of cancellation, the following charges will apply:

It offers a summary of how these new benefits operate and illustrates the significant changes involved. It also includes other changes associated with welfare reform, including changes to contributory Employment and Support Allowance (ESA), the 'bedroom tax', benefit cap and a lot more besides.

## Seeking Work and Sanctions under Universal Credit - 1 day

Welfare reform includes increased requirements attached to claiming benefits, particularly Universal Credit. In addition, a new sanctions regime for all existing benefits (including JSA) will be introduced with the launch of Universal Credit.

By the end of this course, you will understand the main rules on requirements to seek work. You will also understand the main causes of sanctions, how to avoid them, what happens to people whose benefits are sanctioned and how to get back on the benefit after sanctions have been applied.
