English language requirement for Citizenship

If you have Indefinite Leave to Remain - as a refugee, humanitarian protection or discretionary leave

Unless an exemption applies, you must meet the English language requirement.

You are exempt if at the date of application for settlement any of the following apply:

- You are aged 65 or over, or
- You have provided evidence that you have have a physical or mental condition which prevents you from speaking or learning English to the required standard

Nationals of majority English-Speaking countries are considered automatically to meet the English language requirement and do not need to show a formal speaking and listening qualification. The list of countries is available at www.gov.uk/guidance/immigration-rules-appendix-koll

You can prove your knowledge of English by having either:

OR

English language qualification

You will meet the English language requirement if you have provided

- a valid digital reference number
- from an <u>approved provider</u>
- showing you have passed an <u>approved</u>
 <u>English language test</u>
- to the <u>required level</u>
- in the two years before the date of application

Required level

At least level B1 CERF

(Common European Framework of Reference)

Approved test and provider

If you are in the UK, you must take a secure English language test (SELT) with one of the below providers. Tests cost between £150-£200.

Academic qualification

You can prove your knowledge of English by having a degree that was taught or researched in English.

Your degree must be academic. You cannot use a vocational degree as proof.

If your degree is from a UK university, you only need your degree certificate.

If your degree is not from a UK university, you will need:

- A copy of your degree certificate
- An Academic Qualification Level Statement (AQUALS)

If your degree is from a non-majority English speaking country you will also need an English Language Proficency Statement (ELPS)

The requirement must be proven by providing the original degree certificate

If you are awaiting graduation or no longer have the certificate and cannot get a new one, you must provide an original:

- academic reference
- academic transcript
